


Pupil Premium at Greenmead Primary School 2018-19

Pupil Premium is additional government funding which targets children on Free School Meals or who are Looked After Children or children of armed forces personnel. It is given in order to improve their attainment and 'narrow the gap' with other children at Greenmead School. In the financial year 2018-19 the amount of pupil premium for each pupil was £1,320 and at Greenmead we have 20 eligible children. This gives a total funding of £26,400.

At Greenmead we have looked carefully at this group of children and chosen to spend the majority of the money on projects which will enhance their experience at this school. Other children will also benefit from these projects.

This is how we have already, or intend to, spend the money from April 2018 to March 2019.



Extended School Parental Support

This directly helps the pupils on Free School Meals access our after school club and Easter and Summer Scheme provision. The children benefit from interacting with their school friends in a relaxed and social atmosphere which focuses on enjoyable fun play activities which are devised to meet their very individual needs

Crooked House for EY for Communicative Play



This little house will be located in the Early Years playground to encourage communication among the children. Communication is a focus at Greenmead this year. This resource will create a space where the children can role play with their peers. There will be good opportunities for communication at these times. There are 3 PPG children who use that playground every day and many more who use it at playtimes. All the children of Greenmead will benefit from this resource.

One day per week of Music Therapy Sessions

A number of PPG children are referred for Music Therapy. The numbers vary from term to term. Music Therapy is the clinical and evidence-based use of music interventions to accomplish individualised goals within a therapeutic relationship. Music therapy enhances communication, self-expression and interaction and can support many aspects of emotional, cognitive and physical development.

One day per week of Play Therapy Sessions


Play Therapy is a new development at Greenmead. A number of PPG children will be referred for Play Therapy. The numbers will vary from term to term. Play Therapy is concerned with child development and attachment (the bonding process). Play therapists are trained to use play, a child's natural form of expression, as a means for understanding and communicating with children about feelings, thoughts and behaviour.

Unallocated Funds

There is £10,250 of unallocated funds at October 2018. We are currently considering other ways to make an impact on our PPG pupils learning and progress between now and the end of March 2019.

What we spent Pupil Premium on last year and its impact

In the financial year 2017-18 the amount of pupil premium for each pupil was £1,320 and at Greenmead we have 23 eligible children.



Extended School Parental Support

This directly helps the pupils on Free School Meals access our after school club and Easter and Summer Scheme provision. The children benefit from interacting with their school friends in a relaxed and social atmosphere which focuses on enjoyable fun play activities which are devised to meet their very individual needs

Personalised Curriculum Resources

Each class teacher was allocated £500 per pupil premium child in their class and asked to purchase personalised resources which would directly benefit their learning. This will be based on end of year pupil data.

Additional support staff member to enhance pupil access to the curriculum and horse-riding

Greenmead employs an additional member of staff to ensure continuity when delivering the curriculum if our permanent staff are released for training, absence etc.

We send three members of staff with the children to Epsom Riding for the Disabled so that the children can enjoy and experience the independence and stimulation of riding a horse. Two staff members are from the class the children are from and the extra person who leads the activity is paid for by Pupil Premium.
