


## PE and Sport Premium at Greenmead Primary School 2021-22

The PE and Sport Premium is additional government funding to improve the quality of PE and sports activities offered to pupils in school. Many of the Greenmead pupils do not undertake conventional PE but the school wants every child to experience some form of physical activity during the school year. The children participate in a well-received annual sport day which is themed to align with the Tokyo 2020 Olympics this year. The total funding for 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 is calculated on pupil numbers and the confirmed amount is £16,638.




### Summary

- We are still working under a COVID driven risk assessment and pool access in the Summer and Autumn terms is limited to post surgery recovery. This will be reviewed for the Spring term nearer the time
- An 89% contribution to the cost of a support staff employee to facilitate swimming means every pupil has access to weekly swimming session which has been very well received by parents and governors. This staff member is a permanent employee
- The Royal Academy of Dance deliver weekly dance sessions through their Radiate Dance Project. This is currently taking place virtually due to Covid-19 restrictions and in line with our Covid risk assessment.
- We have also set aside some of this grant to be able to keep resources fresh, accessible and up to date for pupils to use during their physical development/PE sessions.

## PE and Sport Premium at Greenmead Primary School 2020-21

The total funding for the financial year 200-21 was £16,407.



### Summary

- School was open during the COVID pandemic. A reduced number of pupils were in during the summer due to shielding but the Autumn and Spring terms saw full pupil attendance.
- Pupils were not able to swim during the pandemic. This was risk assessed by the SLT taking into consideration the safety of staff and pupils. The staff member is a permanent member of the team and therefore the salary continued to be drawn.
- The Royal Academy of Dance were able to deliver weekly dance sessions through their Radiate Dance Project. This took place virtually with a smaller number of classes due to Covid-19 restrictions and in line with our Covid risk assessment. The participating class reported how important this session was for pupil wellbeing.
- PE Equipment expenditure: new yoga mats were bought for the whole school. These mats are thicker and more supportive for our pupils and are used on a regular basis in PE lessons.
