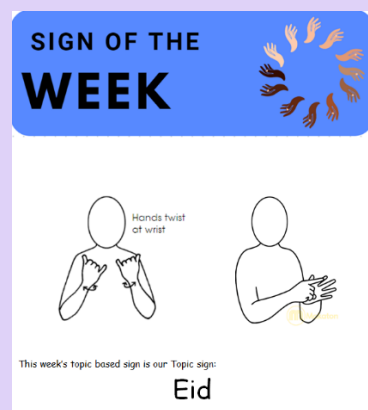

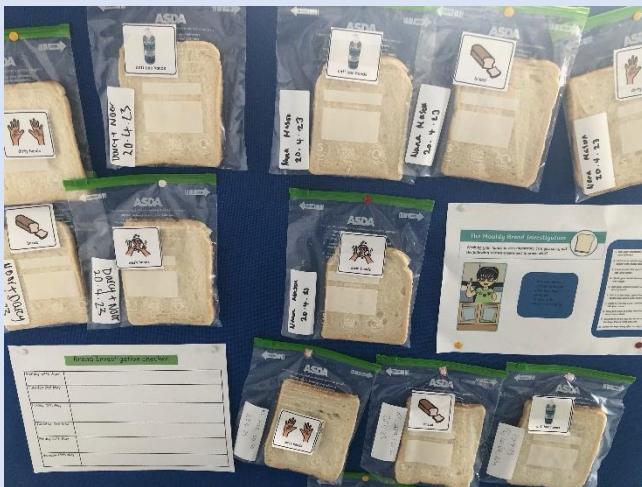


From the classrooms.....
